TWP also provides supportive services for eligible customers, such as, needs-based allowance, reimbursement for transportation, and financial assistance for child care.</p>

Assists adults to become literate and obtain the knowledge and skills necessary for employment; assists adults in attaining a high school equivalency diploma and in preparing for college or other types of job training; and, assists immigrants and other individuals to learn English.</p>

NYSDOL also offers services to unemployed veterans and assists workers who have lost or may lose their jobs as a result of foreign trade.</p>

Services include vocational counseling and guidance, evaluation of skill-sets, occupational training, job-preparation services, and job placement. ACCES-VR also provides job coaching for those individuals who would benefit from a staff person teaching them their job duties, one-on-one, at the worksite.</p>

NYSCB offers Counseling, Assessment Services, Skill Training, and Employment Services. Employment Based Services include Placement Services, Work Experience Training, Work Readiness, On-the-Job Training (OJT), Work Try Out (WTO), Internships, Interim Job Coaching, and Supported Employment. Staff of the Commission for the Blind will also advise the legally blind of other services or accommodations which would help them better perform their job.</p>

SCSEP participants gain work experience in a variety of community service activities at local non-profits, government agencies &amp; churches, including schools, hospitals, day-care centers, and senior centers. Participants receive an initial assessment, referral to programs, referral to supportive services, an Individual Employment Plan (IEP), career planning, counseling, internships and work experiences. Program covers participants in Nassau, Suffolk &amp; Queens.</p>

DSS programs include: Temporary Financial Assistance, Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) to help needy families purchase healthy and nutritional foods, Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP) to assist low income people pay the cost of heating their homes, assistance in finding employment, child support payments, child care assistance, as well as, child and adult protective services.</p>
